The Living Stone

Jesus, the living stone, is a testament to the integrity of the Scriptures. God directed Moses to strike a rock in the Sinai desert, and Israel drank water from the split rock. The rock represents Christ, stricken in Calvary to produce the living water. With his fingers, God inscribed the Ten Commandments on the stone tablets and gave us rules for living. The word of God became flesh in Jesus, completed the old law, and gave us the new law of salvation. Abraham placed Isaac, the son of God's promise, upon a rock for sacrifice in Mt. Moriah.

The very place that Abraham placed Isaac was at

Cavalry in Jerusalem, where Jesus, God's only begotten son, became the lamb to take away the sin of the world. On Easter morning, angels rolled the stone from the rock tomb, and Jesus rose again. The split rock at Horeb was a foreshadowing of Christ's resurrection. The fulfillment of these prophetic events testify that Jesus is the Messiah (Christ) and the son of God. After God revealed these truths to Simon, Jesus gave Simon the name Peter (rock) and built his church upon Peter's confession. Jesus is the rock of salvation, our refuge and shield. A life built upon the rock is secure from any and all storms. All other around is sinking sand.
