Footprints to Emmaus

It was Easter Day when two disciples made their way to Emmaus, their hearts heavy with grief. As they walked, a stranger joined them, talking and walking beside them. What they didn't realize was that this stranger was Jesus himself. When they finally arrived in Emmaus and sat down to eat, Jesus broke bread with them, and in that sacred moment, their eyes were opened to recognize him. Their story mirrors our own in many ways. In times of sorrow and struggle, we too often feel that God is absent. Yet, that sense of absence is not reality—it is spiritual blindness. The truth is, God is always with us. This is beautifully echoed in the well-known poem "Footprints in the Sand." When we look back on the hardest moments of our lives and see only one set of footprints, we may feel abandoned. But in truth, those footprints belong to God, carrying us and holding us close, even when we couldn't feel him. What we see with our eyes is only part of the picture. The deeper, hidden work of God continues quietly and faithfully.

We all need to open our spiritual eyes to see the true and whole picture of our situation. So when our path feels like the road to Emmaus and God's presence seems far away, let us remember: Jesus is walking beside us, unseen but unwavering.

Our faithful companion never leaves our side.
