QUALIFICATIONS OF A MISSIONARY

Moses hesitated when God first called him at the burning bush on Mt. Horeb. God revealed His name, the Great I Am, to Moses. God showed him signs, turning his staff into a snake and making his hand leprous; despite these signs, Moses made an excuse, saying he was slow of speech and tongue, and asked God to send someone else. Yet even with his doubts about his qualifications, God paired him with his brother Aaron to support him.

Similarly, as followers of Jesus, we may respond to our callings as Moses did. It's natural to feel overwhelmed or unqualified, but we can take comfort in knowing that "God chose the foolish things of the world to shame the wise; God chose weak things of the world to shame the strong" (I Corinthians 1:27). God does not call us because we are the most talented, but because He values our humility and wants to use us for His purposes. He already knows our weaknesses and provides us with ministry partners, just as Jesus sent out the disciples two-by-two.

The stage is being set for Christ's return, and as Jesus said, "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few." Although there are 2.4 billion Christians worldwide, they represent only about 30% of the global population; the Great Commission is still ongoing. To reach the remaining 70%, we need more workers willing to serve. Even if we're not as eloquent as Paul or able to go on foreign missions, praying for more harvesters is one of the most powerful ways we can contribute.
